
## **NOD BROOK**



## NOD BROOK

Nod Brook is a beautiful and easily accessible spot which incorporates open fields, two ponds, and the Farmington River. Hiking here is easy and level with a nice view of Talcott Mountain above.

This area is one of four State hunting dog training and field trial areas. Be aware that hunting is allowed during field dog trials and during hunting season. Public use is prohibited by law when a field dog trial is being held since live ammunition is being used. Please read the signs upon entering the area!

The northern half of Nod Brook is an open, flat meadow with a dirt road running along the Farmington River. The southern half contains two ponds with dirt roads around them. You can hike on the level roads and enjoy the view of Talcott Mountain and the surrounding hills and woods along the river. Because of the rich and varied habitat, this is a tremendous place to bird watch, especially during spring and fall migrations. There is also an area to launch canoes into the river at the northern end of the ponds.

Access this area from Route 10 to the Tower Business Park. Cross the Greenway blacktop, take a right down the dirt road then take either fork at the bottom of the hill and park.
